POSITION OBJECTIVES

- Exercise personal judgment within agreed standards to respond to a service request on the same day it is received and to encourage/support other staff to do the same.

KEY RESPONSIBILITY AND DUTIES

- Manage the delivery of the capital works program component of Council's Move, Connect, Live strategy that includes development of concepts and draft designs, consultation with community and relevant authorities, securing the necessary permits and ensuring the delivery of projects on time and within budget.
- Liaise with all staff, Councillors and the community to resolve service user concerns and issues in a friendly manner within the framework of Service Principles.
- Provide professional traffic engineering advice to Council and the Port Phillip community, including report preparation, attendance at public meetings and liaison with other service authorities, agencies and resolution of community enquiries.
- Assist with the management of the all road user safety program, including seeking and applying for blackspot and other external funding.
- Carry out such duties, as directed, as are within the limits of the incumbent's skill, competence and training.
- Provide assistance to other Transport Engineers and Strategic Transport Officers as required.
- Consider the environment and environmental objectives in all Council projects.
